We have a unique position of stewardship and influence in Letchworth. This guides our mission: To preserve Letchworth's buildings and green spaces. We provide support for education and learning opportunities and prioritise health and well-being. We will continue to support local charities and promote charitable activities to enrich the lives of our vibrant community.

Above all else, this policy and accompanying strategy aims to work in harmony with existing strategic objectives, charitable objects, the garden city principles, and Letchworth's sense of place.

The Foundation is therefore committed to:

- 1. Optimising community re-investment through maximising income generation. Through effective management of our estate, property letting and investment activities we will amplify our positive impacts on society and business in the area.
- 2. Focusing our valuable resources to establish opportunities for innovation that supports sustainable development, including climate mitigation and adaptation.
- 3. Transitioning to low carbon energy where we have financial responsibility, and encouraging others to do the same.
- 4. Supporting sustainable decision making by raising awareness of the local community and other stakeholders.
- 5. To support homeowners and housing association partners in their endeavours to make homes more efficient, whilst preserving their heritage value and character in line with the provisions of the Scheme of Management.

- Seizing opportunities to positively influence change by facilitating collaboration with, and between our partners. Including but not limited to other businesses, councils, charities, residents, visitors, and local organisations.
